Over the past few centuries, manufacturers have been modifying the design of keyboard instruments as a way to expand the instrument's capabilities; these modifications include the keyboard ranges, their dynamic levels, the pedals, the number of manuals, as well as electronic augmentations. The earliest record of double harpsichords can be found from the last quarter of the 16th century, where the manuals were pitched a fourth apart to facilitate transposition. Later, in the 17th century, harpsichords with different numbers of registers and manuals were built - a few double-manual Italian harpsichords with two 8' registers and one 4' register were made from the middle of the 17th century. Harpsichords with richer and fuller sound were also built later in the 18th century, opening up a variety of possibilities for new repertoire. Later, the two-manual concept was adapted to the piano, and the Moór piano, as well as the hyperpiano, represent a culmination in the evolution of keyboard instruments. With the expansion of the keyboard's capabilities in the two-manual harpsichord, players were able to play technically challenging passages in a close position, as well as give clarity to dynamic contrasts. Composers composed a number of works in response to these innovations, ranging from François Couperin's Pièces de clavecin, J.S. Bach's Clavier-Übung II and Goldberg Variations, to Ligeti's Continuum. This repertoire was written specifically for two-manual harpsichords and requires great technical command of the instrument. This project explores the history and the repertoire of double manual and other extended keyboard instruments, and examines the significance of using such instruments in selected musical examples. It also investigates repertoire that can be performed more effectively on a double manual keyboard instead of an ordinary piano due to textural issues, overlapped passages, and other technical demands.

A History of the Harpsichord brings together for the first time more than 200 photographs, illustrations, and drawings of harpsichords in public museums and private collections throughout Europe the United States. Covers the period from 1500 to 1800. A chapter is devoted to each of the five most important schools of harpsichord making. Plates illustrate the most typical harpsichords of each country.

The name of Ruckers is as important to early keyboard instruments as Stradivarius is to strings. This book describes in close detail the art and technique of the Ruckers family, who produced harpsichords and virginals throughout a period of over 100 years. Dr O'Brien provides detailed information about the construction and decoration of Ruckers harpsichords and virginals, as well as the numbering, pitch, stringing, and the determination of the original state of their instruments. Like Stradivarius violins, Ruckers instruments were later altered, and the nature and musical significance of these alterations are discussed, as is the influence of the Ruckers style on later building practice. The instruments in their original and altered states are considered in relation to the music of the time and to contemporary performance practice. The text is richly illustrated with diagrams and pictures of original instruments, and with plan-view photographs reproduced at a scale of 1:10. The book also contains a partially illustrated catalogue of authentic and fake instruments, followed by extensive appendices.

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
