Growth predominately concentrates on the physical changes that take place across different parts of the body. Growth is measured using a range of intervals such as height and weight. Centile charts are used to measure changes in growth. Different centile charts are used to measure the height and weight of boys and girls because of the difference in growth patterns, for example, boys tend to be heavier and taller.

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Two more normal patterns of growth in children. Cephalocaudal growth pattern implies that in a child head growth occurs before the neck growth, and arms and trunk grow before the legs. Distoproximal implies that a child's trunk and arms become functional before the hands and fingers.

The growth of children is observed to follow an expected pattern. They follow a successive developmental stage each supporting the other stage of development. At times there are delays in achieving this milestone which allows further investigation as to why the delay has been occurred.

Do not be concerned if your child is not meeting all the milestones for their age range; it is perfectly normal for one area to develop quicker than another.

A final growth spurt begins at the start of puberty, sometime between ages 9 to 15. The child's nutrient needs correspond with these changes in growth rates. An infant needs more calories in relation to size than a preschooler or school-age child needs. Nutrient needs increase again as a child gets close to adolescence.

In general, the velocity of growth decreases from birth onward (and actually from as early as the fourth month of fetal life; see below), but this decrease is interrupted shortly before the end of the growth period. At this time, in boys from about 13 to 15 years, there is marked acceleration of growth, called the adolescent growth spurt. From birth until age four or five, the rate of growth in height declines rapidly, and then the decline, or deceleration, gets gradually less, so that in ...

Human growth from infancy to maturity involves great changes in body size and appearance, including the development of the sexual characteristics. The growth process is not a steady one: at some times growth occurs rapidly, at others slowly. Individual patterns of growth vary widely because of differences in heredity and environment.

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
