Walking & Hiking - Loch Lomond & The Trossachs National Park

The new Loch Lomond National Park has ensured protection for what is not only Britain's largest freshwater lake, but one of its most beautiful, celebrated in ballad and song. West of Loch Lomond are the steep Arrochar Alps towering above Loch Long together with scores of much less visited lower hills stretching down to the seaboard.

Loch Lomond and the Trossachs (Walkhighlands)

The Loch Lomond hike from Balmaha to Millarochy Bay is a stunning lochside walk along part of the West Highland Way. This is quite an easy walk, so it can ease you in. If you venture a little further to Salloch Bay, then you'll see the ruins of an abandoned highland crofting community. View the route.

No matter if you want to go hill walking on challenging paths or just have a short walk or cycle with the whole family on one of the easier paths, you will find the right route for you. The West Highland Way is one of the most popular long distance walking routes in Scotland. It starts in Milngavie nearby Glasgow and passes through The Park along Loch Lomond and then after 151 km (96 miles) it finishes in Fort William in the Highlands.

The Dukes Pass (5km) - popular walk by Loch Goil, taking in rugged scenery; Ardyne forest (1.5 miles) - a lovely forest walk with a clearly marked trail; Doon hill and Faerie Knowe (4 miles) - passes through woodland, countryside and riverside; Balmaha Millennium Forest path (1 mile) - walk alongside Loch Lomond and explore Balmaha village

Walking routes around Loch Lomond and the Trossachs ...

Located on the eastern side of Loch Lomond and also on the Highland Boundary Fault Line, walkers leave the popular village of Balmaha for a short but fairly stiff climb to the top of Conic Hill, 361m high. The rewards come in the expansive views seen throughout the walk and from the top. Dundurn - St. Fillans

From Inveruglas a ferry across the loch enables a link with the West Highland Way, so with the possible link to the Kintyre Way via the Portavadie Ferry, the Loch Lomond and Cowal Way could be one link in an epic walk through Scotland. Another option is to link from Arrochar with the Three Lochs Way which leads to Balloch.

Loch Lomond and Cowal Way (Walkhighlands)

Enjoy this lovely woodland walk through Drumkinnon Wood which runs along the length of Loch Lomond Shores. You can enter from each side, either from the gate located on the pathway to our overflow carpark or from Pier Road just up from our beach. The walk is gentle for all the family, and the trees offer you protection on a wet day.

Walking the National Park - Loch Lomond Shores

Loch Lomond and the Trossachs are the beginning of the big hills of the Scottish Highlands. And given that they stand in the front doorway, it's only right that they are the friendly and welcoming ones. Instead of huge crags and airy, scary ridges, here are small paths that weave uphill among boulders and little lumpy outcrops.
