Dental caries is a major public health problem in most industrialised countries, affecting 60% to 90% of school children. Community water fluoridation was initiated in the USA in 1945 and is currently practised in about 25 countries around the world; health authorities consider it to be a key strategy for preventing dental caries.

Dental caries was first described in Miller's chemoparasitic theory in 1890 . Caries is caused by the dissolution of the teeth by acid produced by the metabolism of dietary carbohydrates by oral bacteria. The 2 primary bacteria involved in caries formation are mutans streptococci and lactobacilli.

In a study by Al-Malik MI, Rehbin YA, titled: Prevalence of dental caries, severity, and pattern in age 6 to 7-year-old children in a selected community in Saudi Arabia, published in Journal of Contemporary Dental Practice 2006 May 1;7 (2):46-54, it was found that caries was diagnosed in 96% of the children.
